

## Go green, organize carpool with Fermilab explores new physics **PACE Rideshare program**



Employees concerned about rising gas prices, Title: NuMI Muon Antineutrinos a weak economy or their carbon footprint can save a little green by pursuing greener transportation to and from work.

> A PACE representative visited Fermilab earlier this week to explain the suburban transit provider's Rideshare, Vanpool and Metra Feeder programs.

The Rideshare program is free, anonymous and Web-based. Riders looking for carpool partners can enter the starting point of their daily commute on the PACE Rideshare Web site. Riders then choose Fermilab from the list of employers for their destination, and select Fermilab again for the street address. Riders can then contact carpool partners without revealing personal information through the Web program.

If you are looking for carpool partners from the West Chicago or Route 59 Metra train stations, enter the address of the train station as the start of your commute in the Rideshare program. You can look up the train station addresses here.

For groups of five or more, PACE offers the Vanpool program for commuting from home and the Metra Feeder program for commuting from Metra train stations. Cost for the Vanpool program is based on round trip distance and willingness to drive and the Metra Feeder program costs a \$58 flat fee per month.

Researchers at Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory seem poised to answer some of the most basic questions in science. But now, the focus of high-energy physics is moving away from Chicago's western suburbs. Europe's Large Hadron Collider is expected to dwarf Fermi's collider into obsolescence. Fermilab now has to figure out how to keep up its prominence, its funding, its relevance. So scientists there are making a big pivot, training their sights on a new physics frontier.

Of all the people at Fermilab – cosmologists, Nobel laureates, John Plese may have the coolest job title: lab herdsman.

PLESE: Well that's the herd bull right there, lying down, getting ready to turn over and itch his back.

On a sunny spring morning, this herd of American bison is lolling in the grass. Plese, a muscled guy with a buffalo tattoo on his right shoulder, has been looking after them for about 20 years.
