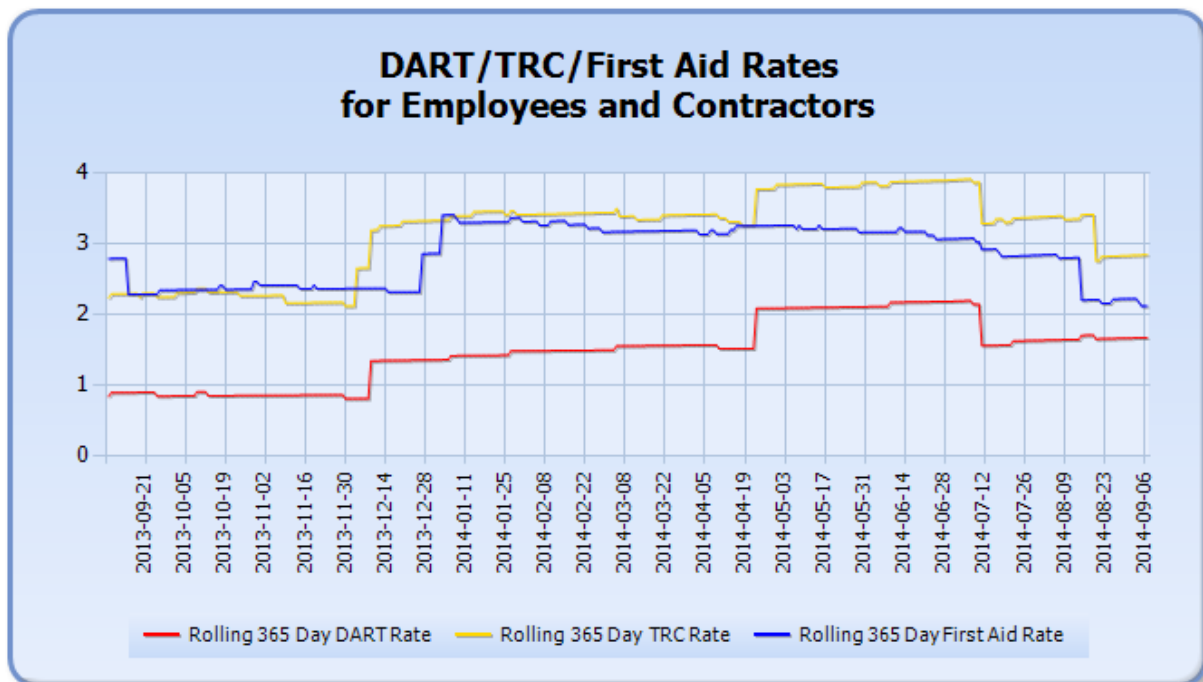
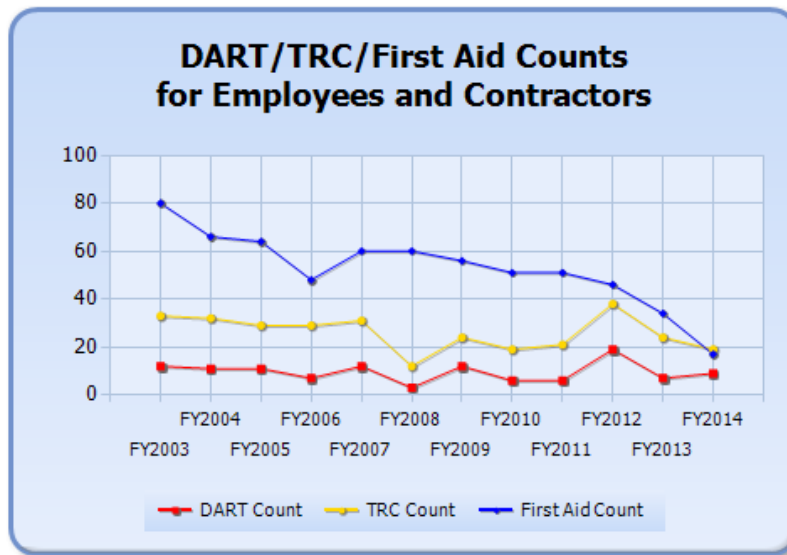

Medical Comments: While removing computer tapes from a box that was inside a larger box on the floor the employee jerked the smaller box and felt "something strange" in his lower back. Did not have initial pain but 40 minutes later on his drive home he had a dull pain. By the time he arrived home he had intense pain. Stayed home resting for 4 days, came to work, unable to work and went home. Saw PCP on 8/28/14. Was given RX.

ESH Comments: Thursday - August 21, 2014 - The boxes that the employee was lifting weighed approx. 18 pounds. There were two of these boxes packed tightly into one larger box. The larger box was sitting on the floor, while the employee bent over to pull one of the smaller boxes out of the larger box. The smaller boxes were packed so tight, that when the employee was pulling out the first box, it created a vacuum. The employee then jerked the entire package while gripping the smaller box with his fingers. It was then that he felt something in his lower back. But he did not feel pain until he went home approx. 40 minutes later. He then felt pain in his lower back, as he was halfway home. The pain continued the next day, (called in sick) and through the weekend, as well as the following Monday, of which he called in sick again. He returned to work on Tuesday Aug. 26th, but only worked a half day because of the pain. He called his personal physician that day and saw his doctor the following day. At the request of his personal physician, he called in sick on Wed. Aug 27th through Tuesday, Sept. 2nd. He returned to work on Wednesday, Sept. 3rd, and reported his injury to the Medical Dept. where he was given restrictions of no lifting. When the employee was asked why he did not report his injury to Medical until several days later, he stated that he had confused reporting an injury with the "greater than three days away requirement" of reporting to Medical. In other words, he thought that since he only originally missed two days from work, he did not have to report to Medical.
